DIVISION I DEFENSE

Kris Patterson

DL, Xavier

Senior, 6-3, 300

A three-year starter at nose guard for the Falcons, Kris had a tremendous season on his way to earning Hartford Courant and Coaches Associations All-State honors. Kris totaled 46 tackles, eight coming for losses, and one quarterback sacks. Kris served as captain and also participates in indoor and outdoor track at Xavier. Among his college choices include Rutgers, UMass, Hofstra, Central Connecticut, Southern Connecticut and Bryant.

Jo-Von Ladson

DL, Hamden

Junior, 6-1, 265

Jo-Von clearly made his impact on the interior for the Division I West champion Green Dragons. A Coaches Class LL All-State selection, Jo-Von was a Second Team All-State pick by the New Haven Register and earned First Team All-Area accolades as well. He had a team-best 13 quarterback sacks and 72 tackles and one fumble recovery. Just a junior, he is already getting interest from schools in the ACC, Big Ten and Pac-10.

Shaquille Marshall

DL, Wilbur Cross

Senior, 6-2, 330

One of the top linemen in the state, Shaquille was a standout for the Governors this season with 77 tackles, 3.5 quarterback sacks and three blocked kicks. An All-State selection by the Coaches Association and a Second Team All-State pick by the New Haven Register, Shaquille's college choices included Hofstra, Stony Brook, Marist and the University of New Haven.

Nick Georgalas

DT, Shelton

Senior, 6-1, 205

A two-way starter for the Gaels, Nick was solid at the tackle position this fall. He recorded 47 total tackles and led the team with four quarterback sacks. As a tight end, he caught two touchdown passes and scored another on a recovery of a blocked punt. A baseball player as well, Nick's a member of the National Honor Society and is considering Penn State, North Carolina and Northeastern for his college destination.

Julian Matheson
DL, West Haven
Senior, 6-1, 305

A dominating defensive presence from his noseman position, Julian was consistently double and triple-teamed by opponents but still managed 34 tackles and two fumble recoveries. A three-year starter, Julian earned All-Levi Jackson and Connecticut Post Second Team All-Star accolades. Also a member of the Blue Devils' track team, Julian is considering Southern Connecticut and the University of New Haven as his collegiate destination.

O'Brien Johnson
LB, West Haven
Senior, 5-10, 228

A three-year starter for the Blue Devils, O'Brien served as captain this season and led the team with 67 tackles. On offense, he rushed for 391 yards and eight touchdowns. A Coaches Class LL All-State selection, he was also a Connecticut Post Second Team All-Star. A four-year letterwinner, O'Brien is the school's all-time leading tackler with 231. O'Brien has many collegiate options, including Southern Connecticut and the University of New Haven.

Senior, 6-1, 195

Senior, 5-11, 195

A versatile defensive player who served as a captain for the Falcons, Dan totaled 73 tackles, 2 quarterback sacks, and made one interception this season. Dan also blocked four punts and one field goal. A Hartford Courant All-State selection, Dan was a Second Team All-Area pick by the New Haven Register. Dan's a leader in Xavier community serving as Student Body President. Among his college choices include Boston College, Villanova, Holy Cross and Fairfield.

Tom Acampora
OL, Cheshire
Senior, 6-0, 250

An All-State selection by the Coaches Association and Hartford Courant, Tom was a standout on the interior for the Division I East champion Rams. Offensively, he led an offensive line that paved holes for an offense that averaged over 28 points a game in 2008. Defensively, he had 53 tackles and three quarterback sacks. Tom hopes to attend UCONN in the fall.

OL, Shelton
Senior, 6-4, 295

Talk about tough – Jon played the whole season with a torn meniscus and still anchored the Gaels' offensive line – one that helped an offense rush for nearly 2,300 yards this season. A Coaches Class LL All-State selection, Jon was a Connecticut Post First Team All-Star and New Haven Register Second Team All-Area pick. OL, Amity
Senior, 6-0, 260

A three-sport athlete who also captains the Spartans' indoor and outdoor track teams, Jason was a solid performer on the interior for the football squad this past fall. A key part of an offense that racked up over 4,000 yards from scrimmage, Jason earned New Haven Register Third Team All-State and First Team All-Area honors. OL, Hamden

Junior, 6-3, 225

A dominating two-way player who played offensive tackle and defensive end, Cameron was an integral part of the Green Dragons' rise to success in 2008. An Honorable Mention All-State and Third Team All-Area honoree by the New Haven Register, Cameron had two quarterback sacks and had 12 pancake blocks. Cameron also plays basketball. Senior, 6-3, 185

A standout receiver for the Tigers this fall, Jack had 1,135 receiving yards and nine touchdown catches on his way to earning Coaches Class MM All-State honors. Jack's best game came against North Haven when he set a school record with 287 receiving yards and added three touchdowns. Jack also serves as the captain of the Tigers' basketball team. Sacred Heart, Western New England, Muhlenberg and Marist are a few of his college choices.

Jay Binkowski
WR, Amity
Senior, 5-8, 175

Jay had a nice year teaming up with All-SCC quarterback Billy Choiniere helping the Spartans to seven wins. Jay caught 44 passes for 897 yards – that's 20.4 yards per catch - and scored 10 touchdowns. On defense, he had 80 tackles and four interceptions. A three-sport athlete – he's an accomplished sprinter and 200-meter relay member (in fact he competed in the Housatonic Division meet this afternoon) and an All-SCC lacrosse player as he will play at Quinnipiac next spring.

Mike Davis
RB, Daniel Hand
Senior, 5-8, 175

A versatile offensive threat for the 7-4 Tigers, Mike accumulated over 1,700 all-purpose yards and 10 touchdowns this fall, including a team-high 875 rushing yards. On defense, Mike recorded three interceptions. A Coaches Class MM All-State selection, Mike also earned New Haven First Team All-Area honors. Mike will play football in college and Western New England, Salve Regina and Springfield are among his choices.

Devon White
RB, West Haven
Senior, 5-8, 211

A power runner who also played linebacker for the Blue Devils, Devon rushed for 800 yards – averaging over 7 yards a carry - and scored 10 touchdowns this season. Defensively, he made 42 tackles. One of the team's captains, he earned All-Levi Jackson honors this season. Devon is still undecided about his collegiate choice.

RB, Wilbur Cross
Sophomore, 5-8, 164

Just a sophomore, James burst on the varsity scene this fall and rushed for 1,151 yards – the 19th best rushing total in the state. He scored 10 touchdowns for the 6-5 Governors and earned New Haven Register Third Team All-Area honors. Look for even bigger things from James over the next two years.

Billy Choiniere

QB, Amity

Senior, 6-2, 205

One of the top two-sport athletes in the area, Billy Choiniere had a big year for the Spartans, leading an offense that averaged just less than 30 points a game. Billy passed for 3,133 yards – good for second among all state quarterbacks - and 31 touchdowns – which was third in the state. A New Haven Register Second Team All-Area selection, Billy is also a standout lacrosse player who will head to Towson University next fall to play for the Tigers.

Billy Ragone

QB, Cheshire

Senior, 6-2, 200

Billy Ragone was more than advertised in 2008. A consensus All-Area and All-State honoree, Billy did his share to help the Rams return to the state playoffs for the first time in 11 seasons. He passed for 2,291 yards and 13 touchdowns, and he rushed for 1,350 yards and 30 touchdowns – yes, 30 touchdowns. And, he also played some defense – registering 67 tackles and five interceptions. Billy is also an All-League basketball player and gets good grades as well – he's off to play for local legend Al Bagnoli next fall at the University of Pennsylvania.

DIVISION II DEFENSE

Rich Gonzalez

DL, Derby

Junior, 5-9, 240

A relentless defender who finished the season with 51 tackles and eight quarterback sacks for the Red Raiders. A Coaches Class M All-State selection, Rich also earned New Haven Register Third Team All-Area honors. Rich is also a member of the wrestling team and would like to play football in college.

DL, Branford

Senior, 5-11, 180

Senior, 6-1, 238

He accounted for 15 touchdowns on the season, including the game-winner in week one against Stratford. DB, Hillhouse
Senior, 5-11, 175

One of the best athletes in the area, Jeremy had a big season for the Academics. He led the state with 10 interceptions and made 68 tackles. Back in week 1, he was named the Tri-State Defensive Player of the Week by MSG-TV after the team's win over Hoboken NJ. He had five special teams' touchdowns, and scored 12 overall. A Coaches Class MM All-State selection, he also made the New Haven Register First Team All-Stater. Also an All-SCC basketball player for the Academics, Jeremy plans on majoring in business playing football in college.

DB, Derby
Senior, 6-2, 175

A two-sport athlete who also plays basketball, Anthony had a fine season in the Red Raiders' defensive secondary. OL, Foran

Senior, 6-4, 270

A two-way standout on the interior for the Division II East champion Lions, Russ is a two-time All-SCC and Coaches Class SS All-State selection. OL, North Haven

Senior, 6-2 285

Ken was a force on the Indians' offensive line this season – helping the North Haven offense rush for over 2,000 yards. PK, Sheehan

Senior, 6-1, 190

Utility, Foran

Senior, 6-3, 215

A two-time All-SCC and Coaches Class SS All-State honoree, Jake White had another stellar season at quarterback for the Division II East champion Lions. He

completed 199-of-293 passes for 3,050 yards. He threw for 28 touchdowns and even rushed for 370 yards and three more touchdowns. He finishes his high school career as the state's record holder for completions in a game and career. Central Connecticut, Hofstra, Stony Brook, UMass, Sacred Heart and URI are among those courting Jake.

Brett Biestek
Utility, Sheehan
Junior, 6-3, 220

Just a junior, Brett is making his scholastic career a memorable one. He racked up 2,806 yards of total offense – seventh highest among all state players. He passed for 2,186 yards and 23 touchdowns, while rushing for another 620 yards and 10 more scores. He was an Honorable Mention All-State pick by the New Haven Register. Brett's also a pretty good basketball player for the Titans. Look for even bigger things from Brett next fall.

Stewart Lamberton
TE, Guilford
Sr., 6-2, 185

A versatile player who saw time on both sides of the ball, Stew caught 17 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns this season. On defense, he made 52 tackles – 43 solo – and had 5.5 quarterback sacks. He also had an interception which he returned for a touchdown. Stew is also a wrestler and has served as captain the last two years. Stew would like to continue his football career and Southern Connecticut, University of New Haven and Western New England are among his choices.

George Gerosa
WR, Branford
Senior, 5-11, 150

A two-way standout for the Hornets, George was a Coaches Class MM All-State selection after making 38 catches for over 600 yards and seven touchdowns. On defense, he had 41 tackles and made six interceptions. George also runs track and will captain the Hornets' lacrosse squad this spring. Among his college destinations include Sacred Heart and University of New Haven.

A.J. Leary
WR, Guilford
Senior, 5-11, 170

A two-way standout at receiver and safety, A.J. had over 870 yards of offense, including 28 receptions and 590 receiving yards. He also caught five touchdown passes and earned New Haven Register Third Team All-Area honors. On defense, he had 43 tackles, two interceptions and three fumble recoveries. Also an All-SCC lacrosse player, A.J. is an Honor Roll student. He will do a post-graduate year at Loomis Chaffee in the fall.

Brandyn Wright

RB, Hillhouse**Senior, 5-6, 165**

A repeat All-SCC honoree, Brandyn was the leading rusher for the Division II West champions as he gained 1,129 yards which ranks among the top 20 in the state of Connecticut. He scored 12 rushing touchdowns and added two more via the catch. A Coaches Class MM All-Stater, Brandyn was a Connecticut Post Second Team All-Star and New Haven Register Second Team All-Area pick. Also a baseball player, Brandyn plans to major in criminal justice and the University of New Haven is one of his top collegiate choices.

Tyler Hames**RB, Foran****Senior, 5-7, 165**

To say Tyler was a scoring threat every time he touched the football would be an understatement as he led the state with 33 touchdowns – 18 via the run, 13 via the pass and 2 via kickoff returns. He ranked fourth in the state with 1,585 rushing yards – averaging 11.2 yards per carry. And, he caught 50 passes for another 978 yards – averaging 19.6 yards a catch. A Coaches Class SS All-State pick, he was a New Haven Third Team All-State selection and a Connecticut Post First Team All-Star. Among his college choices include the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, Assumption, WPI, and Salve Regina.

Bernard Risco**RB/QB, Hillhouse****Senior, 5-11, 175**

The lone captain of the Division II West champion Academics, Bernard accounted for 23 touchdowns this fall – 13 passing and 11 via the run. He passed for 900 yards and rushed for 750 more and was the catalyst of the Hillhouse offense that averaged over 33 points a game. The recipient of the Floyd Little Scholarship, Bernard hasn't decided on his college yet, but does want to major in engineering.

Andrew Luzzi**QB, Branford****Junior, 6-0, 185**
