SCC Basketball Contests to Be Televised in 2009 *WTNH.Com/MyTV9 Will Showcase Seven Games, including the SCC Boys and Girls Championship Games*

The Southern Connecticut Conference will be prominently featured on the WCTX/My TV 9 "High School Basketball Game of the Week" television package this winter. Seven contests involving nine boys and girls teams from SCC member schools, including both the league's boys and girls championship games, will be televised. Games will be streamed live on WTNH.com, and be replayed on Saturday evenings at 8 p.m. on WCTX/ MyTV9.

"We are pleased that WCTX/MyTV will showcase some of the SCC's outstanding boys and girls basketball teams this winter" said SCC Commissioner Al Carbone. "And to have our league championship games televised adds more excitement for everyone involved, especially our student-athletes."

Since the league's inception in 1994-95, SCC has enjoyed success in boys and girls basketball. Last year, the Career girls won the SCC league title on its way to winning the Class LL championship and finished number-one in the state. Two years ago, the Hillhouse boys program won the back-to-back state titles (2006 and 2007) on its way to finishing as the top team in the final state polls.

Founded in 1994, the Southern Connecticut Conference celebrates its 15th season of competition in 2008-09 with 23 member-schools and nearly 23,000 students. Recognized as the premier athletic league in the state of Connecticut, SCC member schools have captured over 260 state championships since the league's inception.
